PUBLISHER'S NOTE



Apple Pie began as a simple book to teach children the alphabet in a unique way, with each page showing what can be done with the apple pie that appears for the letter A. Though books containing an Apple-pie ABC can be traced back to 1819, Kate Greenaway's version, first published in 1886, became most popular due to her unique style of illustration.

Greenaway's illustrations were of curly-haired children all modestly dressed in smocks, bonnets, shawl-like coats and mackinaws. They depicted innocence and the old-fashioned clothing she drew was considered charming by people of the day. Liberty of London even adapted Greenaway's drawings as designs for actual children's clothes which proved to be extremely popular.

Kate Greenaway's illustrations were so influential that, in 1999, 14 years after her death, an award for children's literature was named in her honour: The Kate Greenaway Medal is awarded yearly by an association of children's librarians for distinguished illustration in a children's book. This award is one of the UK's oldest literature awards, and the only one that is solely given for recognition of outstanding illustration.
